ESTATE PLANNING

What is Estate Planning?

It is good practice to have a plan for the end of our lives—things like trusts, wills, life insurance, and funeral arrangements can all be incredibly helpful for our loved ones who will deal with our financial affairs. In addition to leaving money for your children or relatives, have you considered your church as a recipient of your financial legacy?

Estate Planning Workshops

We offer free estate planning workshops throughout the year. These ninety-minute sessions teach you to have a plan for the stewardship of your estate at death. The service includes free customized documents and private follow-up meetings. To find out when our next workshop is scheduled please go to vineyardcolumbus.org/ministries/financial-ministry/events. Alternatively, many people consider creating or updating documents with their personal attorney. We encourage estate planning whichever way is most convenient for you.

Special Arrangements

Consider Vineyard Columbus in your charitable planning if you are obtaining or updating your estate planning documents or evaluating things like Charitable Trusts or Donor Advised funds. TITHE, OFFERINGS, AND PROPERTY

1. Tithes and Offerings

We encourage attendees to tithe (10% of your gross income). Cash and checks are received during worship services or mailed to the attention of the Finance Department. You can also give online at vineyardcolumbus.org/give or use **text-to-give** at **614.333.0330**. Quarterly and annual giving statements are mailed to those that give via checks, online or in cash envelopes with contact information provided. For questions about your giving or online assistance, contact our finance department (information on the back).

2. Story Continues Campaign

To give to this campaign or make adjustments, please go to thestoryvc.org/give or contact our finance department (contact information on the back). If giving in person, please write “**The Story Continues**” in the memo line or utilize envelopes available in the lobby.

3. Appreciated Stock or Mutual Funds

You may have invested money in the stock market that has increased in value. Did you know you may be able to donate the stock directly without having to pay capital gains tax and may qualify for tax deductions? If you are interested in learning more contact your tax advisor, investment advisor or Kent Irwin.

4. Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD's)

If you are over 70.5 years old, you may be required to withdraw money from your retirement fund. You can also request that funds be made payable directly to a non-profit organization. This could reduce your taxable income while also supporting the ministry of Vineyard Columbus. Contact your financial advisor for more information about making a QCD.

5. Beneficiaries

6. Property

- Property and real estate can be sold and the proceeds contributed to the church, if you are not able to do that you may be able to donate it directly to the church, contact us for more information.

- Infant supplies can be donated for women facing unintended pregnancies. Please visit vineyardcolumbus.org/valuelife for a list of needed items.
